Message from the President

First, I want to wish everyone a very healthy, happy and peaceful secular New Year! May 2025 be a better year for many of us, a year of peace, health, happiness and wishes that come true.

his past month we participated, specifically, in two very special events: a successful sisterhood shop til your drop vendor fair (something we haven't had at CBT for many years) and also a very joyous and uplifting Chanukah party. Christmas and Chanukah coincided this year – the practice of giving gifts exists in both holidays, although Christmas gift giving is more pronounced. I began to wonder what the significance and history of is giving gifts on Chanu-

kah. I found some of my a pauper, who has no answers in one of the National Jewish Outreach Programs (NJOP) articles on giving gifts. I would like to share with you excerpts from this short article.

a pauper, who has no money at all, is require to borrow money in order to buy oil for lighting. People therefore began to give a lighting till money (gelt) to the poor so that they work

The article began with a quote from Talmud Shabbat 23b: "A person who is diligent in lighting Chanukah candles will have children who are scholars".

The desire for scholarly children was actually one of the motivations for the custom of giving Chanukah gelt (money). In modern times, money has been replaced by Chanukah presents. What is the connection between Chanukah lights, intelligent children and gelt?

P ublicizing the miracle of Chanukah is so important that even

money at all, is required to borrow money in order to buy oil for lighting. People therefore began to give a little money (gelt) to the poor so that they would not be embarrassed or forced to ask for assistance. Because the idea of "being diligent in lighting the Chanukah lights" is primary in both giving to the poor and meriting wise children, it became the custom to give children gelt as a reward for studying. Children who were diligent in their studies were rewarded with a shiny coin.

W hile gifts are an offshoot of the holiday, they represent an important element of Chanukah—chinuch, Jewish education.

The Maccabees fought so that their children and their children's children would be able to study Torah freely and be knowledgeable about their Jewish heritage. Jewish children are taught about Judaism not only for today, but for posterity as well, as it says in Proverbs 22:6: "Educate a young person in his/her own way, when he/she grows old he/she will not turn from it."

ver time, the simple practice of giving gelt (coins or presents) became a Chanukah custom – and not just for children. In truth, however, it is not surprising that gift-giving has moved beyond just children. In our own day and age, we, the adults, also need encouragement to learn about who we are and what our Jewish heritage means. Thus, hopefully, when we gave this year's Chanukah presents, we all remembered to give presents that represented the timeless messages of Chanukah.

n conclusion I would like to point out that in the Chanukah stories we recall the great miracles bestowed upon the Jewish people in the time of the Maccabees. While it may be harder to recognize in our busy lives, but miracles do often happen on a daily basis while we strive to hold on to the past while looking toward the future. Chanukah with its shining lights, surely projects a bright and bountiful future for all of us.

S o, this Chanukah, let the story of the Maccabees inspire us as to what is possible when we remain vigilant in defending our culture, values, and ideals, Let the story of the Maccabees motivate us to do everything in our power to protect Jewish lives. We must never be silent or paralyzed in the face of evil and terror."



Meet our honorees:

Meredith Bernstein

I was born and raised in Wantagh, where my parents became members of the Wantagh Jewish Center (WJC) in 1975. I attended the Doris Kramer Preschool, GAN camp, and Hebrew School there. While growing up, I was a camp coun-

selor in the camp program, active in USY and was the president of the chapter at WJC. In 1994 before my senior year of High School, I traveled with USY to Israel.

I attended SUNY Albany for college, where I majored in Biology and minored in Judaic studies. I graduated from New York College of Osteopathic Medicine and completed my residency in pediatrics and fellowship in Neonatology at Cohen Children's Medical Center on Long Island. I currently work as an attending Neonatologist there.

After getting married, my husband and I settled back in Wantagh in 2009 to start and raise a family. My children attended the Doris Kramer Preschool and have continued in the Hebrew School. While my children attended Hebrew school, I joined with Robin to help improve the Junior congregation services. Together with Robin, we are helping the children learn the Fri-

day night and Saturday Shabbat services to prepare them for their Bar/Bat Mitzvah's and Jewish life.

We are especially proud this year as our Hebrew School class did an amazing job leading the Family High Holiday Services. This year, like last year, we intend to organize a Challah bake for the Hebrew school families.

I am currently on the board of Trustees at CBT and hope to help further our Hebrew School and foster Jewish learning for our school children. I hope that they will enjoy Judaism as much as I did growing up!

sacrifice and commitment to their country has too often been forgotten.


The real battle lies in coming home to a changed and divided America, to angry protesters and a country that wants to forget Vietnam.



Bikur Cholim Committee News

Bikur cholim (also transliterated bikur holim) refers to the mitzvah (lewish religious commandment) to visit and extend aid to the sick. It is considered an aspect of gemilut chasadim (benevolence, selflessness, loving-kindness). It is traditional to recite prayers for healing, such as the Mi Shebeirach prayer in the synagogue, and Psalms on behalf of the sick. Bikur holim societies exist in lewish communities around the world. The earliest bikur holim society on record dates to the early Middle Ages. The roots of bikur holim can be traced back to the Torah, when G-d visits Abraham after his circumcision (Genesis 18:1).



Here at Congregation Beth Tikvah our committee strives to keep in touch with members who are ill or even just need to have their day brightened a bit. We send cards, make phone calls, visit and may even provide a drive to an appointment or assist with occasional shopping.

Because of Israel's unique location, it is a stopping point for countless species of birds during their seasonal migrations between the northern and southern hemispheres, and those birds rely on the presence of trees. By planting trees, you actively participate in the global effort to create a greener, more sustainable world.

The current situation where Israel is constantly bombarded by missile attacks has taken its toll on Israel's tree population, so there is an extra need to replenish trees lost during the conflict.

If you have a Simcha you wish to commemorate, have lost a loved one and wish to leave a living memorial, or even for no reason in particular, planting a tree is one of the most vital things you can do to sustain the land.


