Message from the President

anuary 2025 was an interesting month for all of us. We started the new secular New Year month with a wonderful Champagne Kiddush (Bruce is back) followed by; an interesting and nostalgic lecture on Zoom on the Golden Age of Radio; a Men's Club sponsored event, in person, featuring speaker-author, Brett Topel, who is well known for his knowledge of the Mets; and a sisterhood sponsored White Elephant event. Of course, our Onegs and Kiddushes continued. I can say that January was an interesting, not an overly hectic month for us. February will be more dynamic and diverse, featuring our yearly, back-bydemand, PURIM BALL.

F or this month's article, I would like to share some information about Antisemitism and China -- both have been sharing a great deal of news space.

Antisemitism and China

A ntisemitism, defined as hostility, prejudice, or discrimination against Jews, has a long and troubled history. While it has been mostly associated with Europe and the Middle East, it is a global issue that permeates various regions, including China. I have recently read several articles about the historical and contemporary perspectives of antisemitism in China, its origins, manifestations, and the response of Chinese society. The information that I found is most interesting and enlightening and I thought I might share some of this information with you.

Historical Context: Early Periods

J ews have had a presence in China for over a thousand years, with the first recorded Jewish community in Kaifeng during the Song Dynasty (960-1279). These Jews, believed to be immigrants from Persia, integrated into Chinese society, adopting Chinese customs and language while maintaining their religious practices. Antisemitism, as it was experienced in Europe, was largely absent in China during this period. The Chinese government's relative tolerance towards different religions allowed the Jewish community to thrive.

The early 20th century witnessed an influx of Jewish refugees fleeing pogroms and persecution in Russia and later the Holocaust in Europe. Many of these refugees found refuge in cities like Shanghai, which became a safe haven during World War II. The Chinese population generally accepted these Jews, and antisemitic sentiments were minimal. However, the influence of Western powers and the introduction of Western ideologies began to introduce some antisemitic notions.

Antisemitism in Modern China

Antisemitism in China is a complex and multifaceted issue. To summarize, as dis-




This is a novel about one woman gone to war, but it shines a light on all women who put themselves in harm's way and whose sacrifice


and commitment to their country

Bikur cholim (also transliterated bikur holim) refers to the mitzvah (lewish religious commandment) to visit and extend aid to the sick. It is considered an aspect of gemilut chasadim (benevolence, selflessness, loving-kindness). It is traditional to recite prayers for healing, such as the Mi Shebeirach prayer in the synagogue, and Psalms on behalf of the sick.

Bikur Cholim Committee News

Bikur holim societies exist in Jewish communities around the world. The earliest bikur holim society on record dates to the early Middle Ages. The roots of bikur holim can be traced back to the Torah, when G-d visits

<u>Abraham</u> after his <u>circumcision</u> (<u>Genesis</u> 18:1).

Here at Congregation Beth Tikvah our committee strives to keep in touch with members who are ill or even just need to have their day brightened a bit. We send cards, make phone calls, visit and may even provide a drive to an appointment or assist with occasional shopping.

cussed above, antisemitism was not prevalent in China, and Jewish communities, such as the Kaifeng Jews, lived relatively peacefully. However, in recent years, there has been a rise in antisemitic sentiments and conspiracy theories in China.

O ne factor contributing to this increase in the spread of antisemitic conspiracy theories, is the belief that Jews secretly control the world. These theories have been propagated through various channels, including books and online platforms. Additionally, the political climate and international relations have played a role in shaping attitudes towards Jews in China.

T he recent conflict between Hamas and Israel has also led to a surge in antisemitic comments and sentiments online in China. This rise in antisemitism is often intertwined with anti-Western sentiments, as some Chinese people view Jews as representatives of Western influence.

D espite these challenges, it is important to recognize that antisemitism in China is not as deeply rooted or widespread as in some other parts of the world. Efforts to combat antisemitism and promote tolerance and understanding are crucial in addressing this issue and fostering a more inclusive society

The Chinese government officially condemns antisemitism and promotes religious tolerance as part of its broader policy of ethnic harmony. These discussions can sometimes legitimize antisemitism under the guise of academic inquiry. However, there is also a strong countermovement within Chinese academia that seeks to promote understanding and combat prejudice. The small Jewish community in China, along with international Jewish organizations, has been active in addressing antisemitism. These efforts include educational programs, cultural exchanges, and dialogues aimed at fostering better understanding and dispelling myths about Jews and Judaism.

A dditionally, the Chinese government has taken steps to address antisemitism, including censoring antisemitic content and promoting positive narratives about Jews. Diplomatic relations with Israel continue to play a crucial role in these efforts.

M any believe that educational and cultural exchanges between China and Israel, as well as other Jewish communities worldwide, have been instrumental in combating antisemitism. These exchanges help to strengthen understanding, showcasing the rich cultural heritage and contributions of the Jewish people.

n conclusion, it appears that while Antisemitism in China is not as pervasive or violent as in some other regions, it remains a concern. It appears to be primarily driven by ignorance and the perpetuation of stereotypes rather than deep-seated hatred. Addressing antisemitism in China requires a multifaceted approach, including government action, community engagement, and educational initiatives. As China continues to engage with the global community, fostering mutual understanding and respect will be essential in combating antisemitism and promoting a more inclusive society. Hopefully this will take place.
